Bushfire Plan Information

With the recent unseasonably hot weather it's an appropriate time to advise you of the procedures The Hills School has in place in the event that there is any bushfire activity in our local area.

The Hills School has been recognised on the List of NSW government schools in identified bush fire prone areas. The Hills School is <u>not</u> in a high risk bush fire prone area. The school has a documented Bushfire Plan which is incorporated into our school's Emergency Management Plan.

Communicating efficiently and effectively with our parents and carers is an integral part of this plan. As you are aware, The Hills School has incorporated an **app** into its parent communication stream. This will enable us to instantly transmit information to parents/carers in the event of an emergency. If you haven't already, you simply download the **Flexibuzz** app to your smart phone (android or iphone), tablet, PC or Mac.

If there is a bushfire in the local area, there are three degrees of response that The Hills School may make under advice from the NSW Rural Fire Service (RFS) and the Department of Education Health and Safety.

If there is a bushfire in the local area, it is the responsibility of parents/carers to monitor communication from the school via the Flexibuzz app.
