#### Principal and Deputy Principal's Report

It has been another wonderful start to the term, with students taking part in many exciting opportunities and experiences. This week we raised money for farmers who live in the Broken Hill region, by all dressing up as farmers. Our school has a great connection with Broken Hill High School, which is one of six schools who we are collaborating with to improve our knowledge and teaching practice as part of the Success for Complex Learners Cluster. Our cluster is currently in the first of a three-year plan to develop and share quality programs and practice as part of a 'Schools Plus – Fair Education' grant. We are continuing to develop and share The Communication Passport as part of this important grant and opportunity. Thank you to everyone for participating in the 'Come as a Farmer Day' and for your kind donations to our farming friends in Broken Hill.

This week, our school took part in a NSW Department of Education initiative called 'External Validation'. Each public school in the state will participate in the External Validation cycle, once, within a five-year period. Schools use 'The School Excellence Framework' to self-evaluate on various aspects of school performance, based on three key domains of Learning, Teaching and Leading. Educational leaders from within the Department of Education review evidence of our self-evaluation and follow-up with an extended visit to the school. As a school, we are always endeavouring to improve in every aspect. The process provided an opportunity to reflect on the areas of success at our school, as well as highlighting our next steps and areas of continued focus. We were very pleased that our evidence demonstrated that we were 'Excelling' across the three domains of Learning, Teaching and Leading. A sincere thank you to all the students, staff and families for the incredibly valuable and important role you all play in the life of The Hills School. We feel it is a tremendous privilege and honour to be Principal and Deputy Principal at The Hills School. While it is important to take time to reflect on and celebrate areas of improvement and success, it is equally important to be continually striving for improvement and excellence. At The Hills School, 'We love learning', and our aim is for all students, staff and families to continue to learn each and every day and to strive to make the next day, even better than the last.

We love hosting visitors to our school and introducing them to our fantastic students.
